



## Grades K-8 Dress Code Policy

### BOYS

- Tops
  - A solid-colored polo shirt of any color without outside advertising. One complimentary Bay Pines' polo shirt will be given to each student. Additional school polo shirts are available for purchase in the office for \$18 each.
- Bottoms (no cargo pockets, athletic shorts, or tight-fitting shorts/pants)
  - **Shorts—Twill\* Khaki\*\* , Navy-blue, or Black that are mid-thigh length or longer**
  - **Pants—Twill\* Khaki\*\* , Navy-blue, or Black (without elastic at the bottom)**
- Shoes
  - Safe close-toed shoes that cover the entire foot must be worn and securely fastened to the feet.
  - Crocs, thongs, flip-flops, shower shoes, skate shoes, or similar types of shoes are not allowed.
- Belts
  - A belt may need to be worn if pants or shorts do not stay at the waist.
- Cold weather (blankets, sleeping bags, Snuggles, etc., are not allowed inside or outside)
  - Outside
    - Coats or sweatshirts of any color may be worn, outside only, as long as there are no skulls, alcohol, or other non-child-friendly themes.
  - Inside
    - Any solid-colored cardigan without wording, outside advertising, etc., are allowed.
    - Coats and sweatshirts are not allowed in the classrooms.

\* **Twill** is a fabric so woven as to have a surface of diagonal parallel ridges. Cotton or polyester fabric is acceptable as long as it has a twill surface.

\*\***Khaki** is a dull brownish-yellow color (tan) and is not being used to describe the fabric within this uniform policy.



## Grades K-8 Dress Code Policy

### GIRLS

- Tops
  - A solid-colored polo shirt of any color without outside advertising. One complimentary Bay Pines' polo shirt will be given to each student. Additional school polo shirts are available for purchase in the office for \$18 each.
- Bottoms (Skirts, skorts, and shorts are to be modest – **they must be mid-thigh length or longer**. Pants, shorts, and capris are to have no cargo pockets and can't be tight or form-fitting (skinny fit or similar). Jeggings, stretch pants, jeans, denim-like material, yoga pants, knit, and spandex are not permitted except for leggings as described below.)
  - **Skirts—Twill\* Khaki\*\*, Navy-blue, or Black** (must have solid-colored khaki, navy-blue, gray, or black leggings or shorts under skirts)
  - **Skorts—Twill\* Khaki\*\*, Navy-blue, or Black** (may wear solid-colored khaki, navy-blue, gray, or black leggings under skorts)
  - **Jumpers— Twill\* Khaki\*\*, Navy-blue, or Black** (must wear solid-colored khaki, navy-blue, gray, or black leggings or shorts under jumpers) (a solid-colored polo must be worn under the jumper)
  - **Pants, Capris, or Shorts—Twill\* Khaki\*\*, Navy-blue, or Black** (pants must be without elastic at the bottom) (shorts must be mid-thigh length or longer)
- Shoes
  - Safe close-toed shoes that cover the entire foot must be worn and securely fastened to the feet.
  - Crocs, thongs, flip-flops, shower shoes, skate shoes, or similar type shoes are not allowed.
- Belts
  - A belt may need to be worn if pants, capris, or shorts do not stay at the waist.
- Cold weather (blankets, sleeping bags, Snuggles, etc., are not allowed inside or outside)
  - Outside
    - Coats or sweatshirts of any color may be worn, outside only, as long as there are no skulls, alcohol, or other non-child-friendly themes displayed on the items.
  - Inside
    - Any solid-colored cardigan without wording, outside advertising, etc., will be allowed.
    - Coats and sweatshirts are not allowed in the classrooms. **This also means that sweatshirts are not to be worn underneath polo shirts or t-shirts on Fridays.**

## Additional Dress Code Notes for Boys and Girls

These dress code guidelines have been adopted with the intent to remind our students that they always represent their Savior, and they will want to make the best possible impression in the way they act and appear. Hopefully, having these guidelines will assist parents and guardians in picking clothes for their children and make it easier for children to select clothes for the school day. We kindly ask and expect students, parents, and guardians to support this dress code.

1. A student will receive a dress code violation form for each violation of the dress code. For every two dress code violations a student accumulates in a quarter, a detention will be issued. Violation forms are to be signed and returned to the student's teacher or main office the following school day. If deemed necessary, a child may be asked to call a caregiver and wait in the school office until a change of clothes has been brought.
2. Clothing must be neat, clean, and in good repair--no torn or tattered clothing will be allowed.
3. Clothing should be sized properly--no tight, oversized, or baggy clothing will be allowed.
4. Sweatpants, athletic shorts, and tear away warm-up bottoms are not allowed.
5. Imprinted clothing or accessories that display music groups, alcohol, drug related items, or non-Christian themes & values are not permitted.
6. Caps, hats, bandanas, etc., are not to be worn in the building.
7. No body piercing will be permitted with the exception of ear piercing.
8. Modest, non-flashy makeup may be worn by girls. If deemed inappropriate (dark eye shadow, bold lipstick, etc.), the faculty may request it be removed.
9. Hair for boys is to be kept at modest length. Girls and boys are to avoid colorful highlights and coloring that would cause a distraction in the classroom; naturally-toned coloration is encouraged.
10. BPLS Spirit Fridays--Each Friday, students may wear a BPLS T-shirt instead of a polo, or they may follow the Monday-Thursday dress code. The only difference about Fridays is the shirt; all other aspects about the dress code remain the same, including bottoms (pants, shorts, etc.).

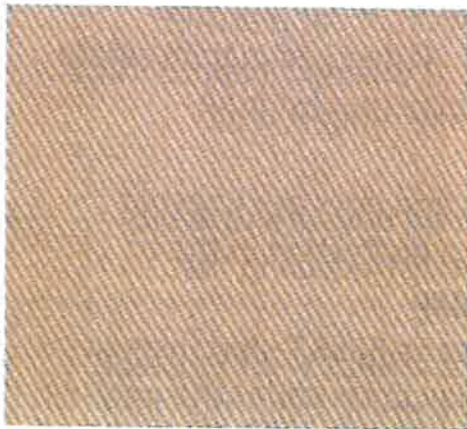
